



Rabbit and Bear Paws Comic and Lesson

Some things to consider when looking at the comic:

- **Why does Bear draw everyone the same way?**

Obviously, Bear has a point of view about how everyone looks to him. Maybe he wants other people to think he and Rabbit look the same. Or maybe Bear doesn't know how to draw too well.

- **What will people in the future think of Rabbit and Bear Paws if they look at Bear's drawing?**

People might think Rabbit and Bear's family all looked the same way. Do they really all look the same way? They don't, but since no one in the future will know what their family looked like, they only have the drawing to tell them.

- **Why does Bear decide to change the drawing when Rabbit talks to him?**

Bear might realize that he made a mistake or that he's showing things wrong. Either way, he's accepting Rabbit's influence on the final drawing.

- **What materials does Bear use to create the drawing?**

The drawing doesn't come out of thin air. Bear had to find the bark and draw on it for the drawing to exist. What would Bear need to do differently if he wanted to make a drawing on a wall? How would that affect how people experience the wall drawing instead of on the bark.
